# Community Information

**Sustainable Timber Tasmania manages Permanent Timber Production Zone (PTPZ) land on behalf of the Tasmanian community for a range of values, including timber production.**

Forestry, mining and recreation have coexisted in the Dial Range since the mid-1800s. Planned forestry operations will not affect recreational use in the Dial Range, including bushwalking, horse riding and mountain biking.

## Key information



Sustainable Timber Tasmania is responsible for the management of a small area (approximately 300 hectares) of Permanent Timber Production Zone land within the broader Dial Range area, which spans around 5,800 hectares. DL011C is an 18-hectare (ha) coupe, in the southern extremity of the Dial Range.



DL011C is regrowth forest established following earlier harvesting operations. The coupe has previously been harvested and successfully regenerated and is not old-growth forest.




High quality sustainably sourced sawlog, power poles, and special species timbers will be made available from this coupe. Products harvested from the coupe can be used for housing construction materials, furniture making and flooring products.



Native seed has been collected from DL011C and will be used following harvesting operations to regenerate the harvested area to native forest.



The Forest Practices Plan for DL011C has been certified. The certified plan outlines how forest operations will be undertaken in accordance with the Forest Practices Code, and is available for viewing and downloading on our website.
