

Modern Slavery Policy

Sustainable Timber Tasmania is responsible for land management and wood production in Tasmania's Permanent Timber Production Zone.

Background

Sustainable Timber Tasmania is committed to conducting its operations ethically and responsibly, respecting human rights, and taking all reasonable steps to prevent, identify and assess modern slavery risks within its operations and supply chains.

Objective

This Policy establishes Sustainable Timber Tasmania's commitment to identifying, assessing, mitigating and addressing modern slavery risks in accordance with the Modern Slavery Act 2018 (Commonwealth) and supports Sustainable Timber Tasmania's values of integrity, accountability and responsible stewardship.

Scope

This Policy applies to all Directors, employees, contractors, consultants and suppliers engaged by Sustainable Timber Tasmania.

Policy

Under this policy, Sustainable Timber Tasmania will:

- Conduct business operations with integrity and uphold internationally recognised human rights.
- Take reasonable steps to identify, assess, mitigate and address modern slavery risks within its operations and supply chains.
- Integrate modern slavery considerations into procurement, supplier engagement and contract management processes.
- Undertake appropriate due diligence of contractors, suppliers and other business partners, with a focus on higher-risk goods, services and jurisdictions.
- Require contractors, suppliers and business partners to comply with applicable laws and demonstrate responsible labour practices.
- Promote awareness of modern slavery risks through education and training for Directors, employees and other relevant personnel.
- Encourage the reporting of suspected modern slavery concerns through management or Sustainable Timber Tasmania's Whistleblower process.
- Investigate reported concerns and, where appropriate, take corrective or remedial action.
- Monitor and continually improve the effectiveness of Sustainable Timber Tasmania's modern slavery risk management framework.
- Prepare and publish a Modern Slavery Statement where required by legislation outlining its approach to identifying, assessing and addressing modern slavery risks.
